



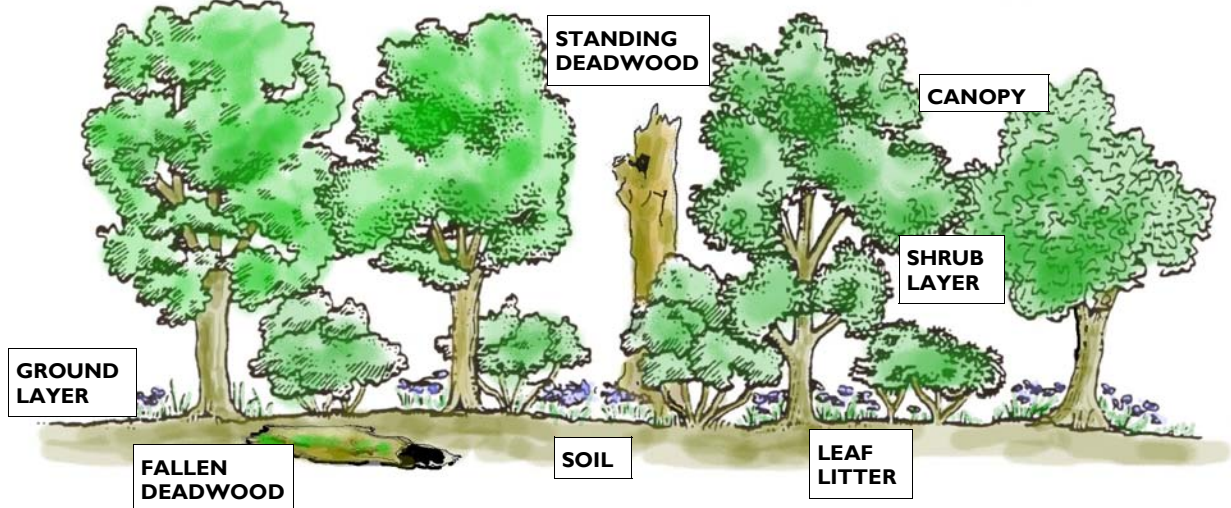
Woodland Habitats I
